## HISTORY

### S.S. MILWAUKEE CLIPPER

The S.S. Milwaukee Clipper is a historic passenger and car ferry that operated on the Great Lakes from 1941 to 1970. Originally built in 1904 as the S.S. Juniata, it was extensively refurbished and renamed in 1941. The ship is notable for its Art Deco design and luxurious amenities. It transported passengers and vehicles between Muskegon, Michigan, and Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Today, the S.S. Milwaukee Clipper is an active and alive museum ship and event center, docked in Muskegon at the historic Grand Trunk Railroad dock. It is recognized as a National Historic Landmark, and the "Flagship of the Port City".

### THE SODA BOWL

The Soda Bowl, originally known as **The Casino**. Slot machines would be available for gambling after the ship was 3 miles offshore under the mistaken belief that the ship was in international waters. After numerous raids by the states of Michigan and Wisconsin, including a Hollywood-style multistate game of hide-and-seek with the captain and slot machines aboard the vessel, the casino was closed. After that, the area was converted to the Soda Bowl so passengers could purchase soft drinks, snacks, ice cream, and magazines. Each of the Soda Bowl's four workers were assigned a drawer in the cash register.
